Yet this is what you do if you neglect his spiritual education. For you keep in your own pocket the gold talent that God intended for you to give your child. If you leave no godly inheritance, what will happen when you die, and the truth of the gospel is buried alongside rotting bones? ...Training your children up in the ways of the Lord is no casual suggestion. Your refusal to obey, whether the product of deliberation or neglect, will pay you bitter wages when you stand before the King of kings in the judgment." -W. Gurnall

Finding a Spouse: "What a shame that women who cultivate inner beauty through God's Word are neglected by Christian men—the very men who most ought to treasure what they have ... The kind of man that a Christian woman wants is a man of the Word of God, a man of prayer, and a man who delights in worship ... Far more important in a man than money, than charisma, and than all the other things the world values is a heart that is turned toward the Lord." -R. Phillips

Patience in Tribulation: "And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience." (Romans 5:3) ...for the Christian who is spiritually minded, tribulation worketh patience. Tribulation is to him like a bitter medicine, bad to the taste but very necessary to health. It is an operation that is necessary for spiritual and heavenly health. ...Spiritual patience is a grace. It is that grace by the power of which the soul becomes willing with the will of God to walk in the way of suffering, knowing that it all must work for his good. A spiritually patient person is one who is strong enough to say, "No matter what the way may be, Thy will is my will, and with pleasure I walk in it." -H. Hoeksema

Our Duty to One Another: "God is always sending people to us in providential ways. We do not know why they came to us, why they pass within the range of our influence. But in whatever way they are sent to us we have some errand to them. They may need our sympathy, our encouragement, our comfort, our protection, the influence of our friendship.
